How To Improve Your Language Proficiency?

1. Develop Your Skills Outside text Contexts: Reading skills required for OET Grade B can be developed through regular reading. Getting familiar with different languages and text types can be useful apart from those that are used in test preparation materials. This is a great way to broaden your reading while following up on your areas of interest. Apart from studying specialist texts, you must consider other texts that are aimed at the intelligent general-interest reader. You can consider websites and resources related to current affairs, science and health, and other topics. This will be a great way to practice.

2. Use the Right Skills For Each Part of reading Sub-Test: The Reading sub-test is designed in such a way that you can use the right reading skills at the right times.

Part A of the Reading Sub-test is about collecting information from different texts, so get ready to move from one text to another. As quickly as you can locate the section of the text you need, the more time you will get to ensure you understand things correctly.

Part B is about understanding the main idea or gist of a short workplace text. You need to choose the most suitable option from 3 available options which could represent the content of the text. You could see all available answer options so that you can check which one is covered completely.

Part C is about understanding the meaning of a line of argument or information in the lengthy text. For this, you need to employ inference skills to comprehend the opinion or attitude of the writer at different points in the text.

3. Check Your Work: There is no doubt that you have to answer every question no matter what, but it is also essential that you take a few minutes to check your answers. In part A, you have to make sure that you have copied the spellings of the answer word (s) from the text exactly. This will prevent you from losing marks unnecessarily for poor spelling. In part B & C, you must locate evidence in the texts which show that your answer is correct and other options are incorrect.

4. Complete The Question Booklet Appropriately: In Part A, write your answers directly on the line given for each question. Part B and C are computer marked; therefore, you must follow the given instructions on the front page before entering your answers.
